Full-time Student Life Animator / Coach

Main areas of responsibility:

A. Supporting students in their journey

The Animator embodies the values of belonging, growth, and leadership by supporting students in their academic, social, and personal development.

- Accompany students on educational outings, community projects, and at least two (2) outdoor trips per school year.
- Supervise students during lunch, recess, and after classes, ensuring a safe, inclusive, and respectful environment.
- Lead or co-lead at least four (4) extracurricular or athletic activities (approximately 40 hours of contact annually).
- Be available for substitute teaching, particularly during the first period and throughout the school day.

B. Contributing to school and community life

The Animator actively contributes to a caring, engaged school culture, aligning with WIC's mission.

- Actively participate in student life activities, committees, and events.
- Collaborate with educational and administrative teams to support students' holistic development.
- Ensure the thoughtful and harmonious application of school rules, including during student and family events.
- Act as an ambassador of WIC values, including supporting sustainability, inclusion, and community engagement initiatives.

C. Supporting the College's educational mission



The Animator enhances the educational experience through their availability, professionalism, and commitment to experiential learning.

- Be present on campus every day, at least 20 minutes before classes start and 15 minutes after they end.
- Provide support through substitute teaching and, if applicable, teach courses aligned with WIC's pedagogical approaches (75-minute periods followed by one hour of weekly student support).
- Participate in all staff meetings, departmental meetings, and professional development days.

D. Committing to ongoing professional development

The Animator contributes to a culture of collaboration, reflection, and professional growth within the WIC community.

- Develop, update, and implement an annual professional development plan aligned with the College's strategic priorities.
- Participate in provided training (experiential learning, leadership, technology integration).
- Share best practices and support colleagues through mentorship or professional collaboration.

Required Qualifications:

- Valid Quebec secondary school teaching permit.
- Excellent written and oral communication skills in French, with a good command of English.
- Demonstrated enthusiasm and passion for teaching and helping students succeed.
- Strong classroom management skills to create a positive and productive learning environment.
- Ability to integrate digital resources and interactive tools into lessons.
- Empathy towards students and the ability to foster a stimulating and caring classroom environment.
- Demonstrated professional autonomy, along with team spirit and collaboration skills.
- Strong willingness to participate in the school's student life activities.
